Mari Kurosaka, although living and working in Paris, demonstrates a magnificent example of approach to authentic oriental art: Meditation, Meditation, then Execution. The entering into a symbiosis with the Spirit and the Breath, a sort of asceticism rooted in a thousand-year old tradition that proclaims: "Conceive All before creating, only thus will the Work be all Energy". The superposition of colours and materials evoke Momoyama lacquers, and still hold the principles of Yin and Yang, the active and the passive, full lines and broken lines, used, this time, to express reflections of a contemporary being.
